These three **palliative aged care programs** can get you started with that can help you embed & **standardise** palliative care assessment (PACOP), **practice** palliative care (PEPA) & **learn** more about what palliative care is (ELDAC), these include:

PACOP helps ACHs embed standardised assessment into routine practice for early identification of deterioration & palliative care needs to improve palliative care outcomes for residents, their families, ACHs & the aged care sector. PACOP is funded by the Australian Government Department of Health.
